Yesterday I finished the girl with no name by Marina Chapman: THE INCREDIBLE STORY OF A CHILD RAISED BY MONKEYS. When she was four years old, she was snatched outside her family's garden in rural Colombia by two men who abandoned her deep in the jungle. Chuck Dial, KB8LJ's Mobile, not Mobile (as in a car) Antenna

U-bolts, wire nuts, polypropylene twine, 10-gauge aluminum wire, clip on ferrite rings, and RG-58 feed line are the magic ingredients comprising this 2 meter antenna, which hangs from Chuck's ceiling. Those odd parts all have their place in this decorative Calder mobile. The antenna's driven element is a j-pole. This keeps the feed line away from the antenna's radiating elements. The elements on either side of the j-pole are passive. 2 mm u-bolts attach an adjustable tuning stub to the end of each element. Wire nuts attach the suspending polypropylene twine to each element. The sharp bottom ends on the passive elements are covered by wire nuts. The wire nuts also add some capacitive loading.

The short (6 foot) feed line attaches to the j-pole's quarter wave matching stub 4 cm up from the stub's bottom using two 2mm U-bolts. After adjusting the element lengths and the quarter wave matching stub, the SWR is under 1.2 to 1 on 146.5 megahertz.

The final touch is 2 clip-on ferrite rings on the feed line at the j-pole matching stub's feed point. This blocks common mode current from the transmission line. If not blocked, those stray currents would reduce radiated power and alter the radiation pattern. Unfortunately, this antenna cannot be rotated without redesign.


