Hams in HOAs May be Able to Raise Antennas!

The Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act was reintroduced by U.S. Senators Roger Wicker, R-Miss, Richard Blumenthal, D- Conn., Representatives August Pfluger, R-Tex., and Joe Courtney, D-Conn, to restore the right to Amateur Radio operators to install the antennas necessary to serve their communities.

According to Senator Wicker, "The Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act would remove unnecessary roadblocks that could help keep communities safe during emergencies like tornadoes, hurricanes, and fires." "When disaster strikes, amateur radio operators provide vital, often life-saving information, which shouldn't be hindered by prohibitive rules or confusing approval processes."




