HAMS TO CHOOSE THEIR OWN CALL SIGN?...It could happen, in fact, it is likely! The concept, which has preliminary FCC approval, calls for the ARRL to issue secondary call signs for use by amateur radio operators who already hold FCC assigned call signs.

The League made the request to the Secretary, FCC, in a letter dated June 17, 1986. ARRL asked for the exclusive role of issuing special amateur radio call signs. The Commission believes that it can legally be done under the existing rules.

Johnny Johnston (W3BE), Chief of the Personal Radio Branch told us he "does not believe there is any legal impediment as long as the FCC assigns the primary amateur radio station call sign. The Bureau Chief (Bob Foosaner) is interested and moving on the concept. It will be discussed at San Diego ARRL National Convention."

The League will have certain guidelines for issuing supplemental call signs. The major stumbling block is a needed provision for "cost recovery." In other words, it won't be free. You'll have to buy the call sign. A translation list made available to the FCC will let them know an amateur's FCC issued call sign. It appears probable that secondary, memorial and special event call signs are on their way back! It could happen this year.

HAM WINS RFI CASE

The superior Court of California, county of San Francisco, has ruled in favor of a radio amateur in an RFI case. Mary Matheny, KB6CLL, was sued by a neighbor for allegedly causing RFI. The court ruled that the state court lacks authority to regulate and control Amateur Radio operators, radio emissions and radio frequency interference, and that maintenance of a state court to regulate and control Amateur Radio operation and radio frequency interference is prohibited by federal law. The court stated "The Federal Communications Commission has the exclusive right and power to regulate, control and sanction amateur radio operations and radio frequency interference."

The court then granted KB6CLL's request for a summary judgment for amateurs facing similar legal actions.

VACATIONING IN MEXICO OR CANADA ??

FCC licenses are valid in Canada under reciprocal operating agreements. You must have your original license, and while telling customs officers about your equipment, it may help to refer them to Memoranda D2-1-1 and D19-4-2. In Mexico, however, the story changes. There is no reciprocal operating agreement, but Mexico does issue operating permits to hams who have General or higher. You have to apply for the permit 6 weeks in advance and include your Mexican visa number..... (from the ARRL Letter via Hamnet/Compuserve and the North Coast Communicator.....)

A FRIENDLY REMINDER

The FCC wants to remind amateurs that transmitting equipment used in other services (except MARS and the like) must be type accepted. Much two meter equipment available today can be made to work on frequencies considerably above and below this amateur band. Amateurs should bear in mind: while it may be a great temptation to do so, the use of gear converted from the amateur service to another service is not permitted.

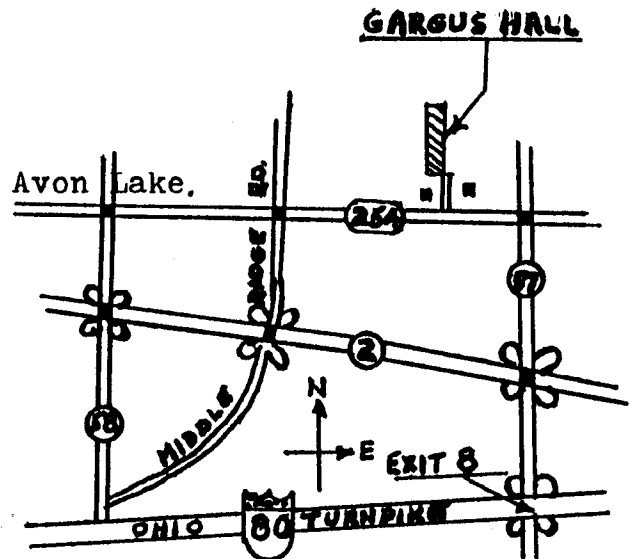

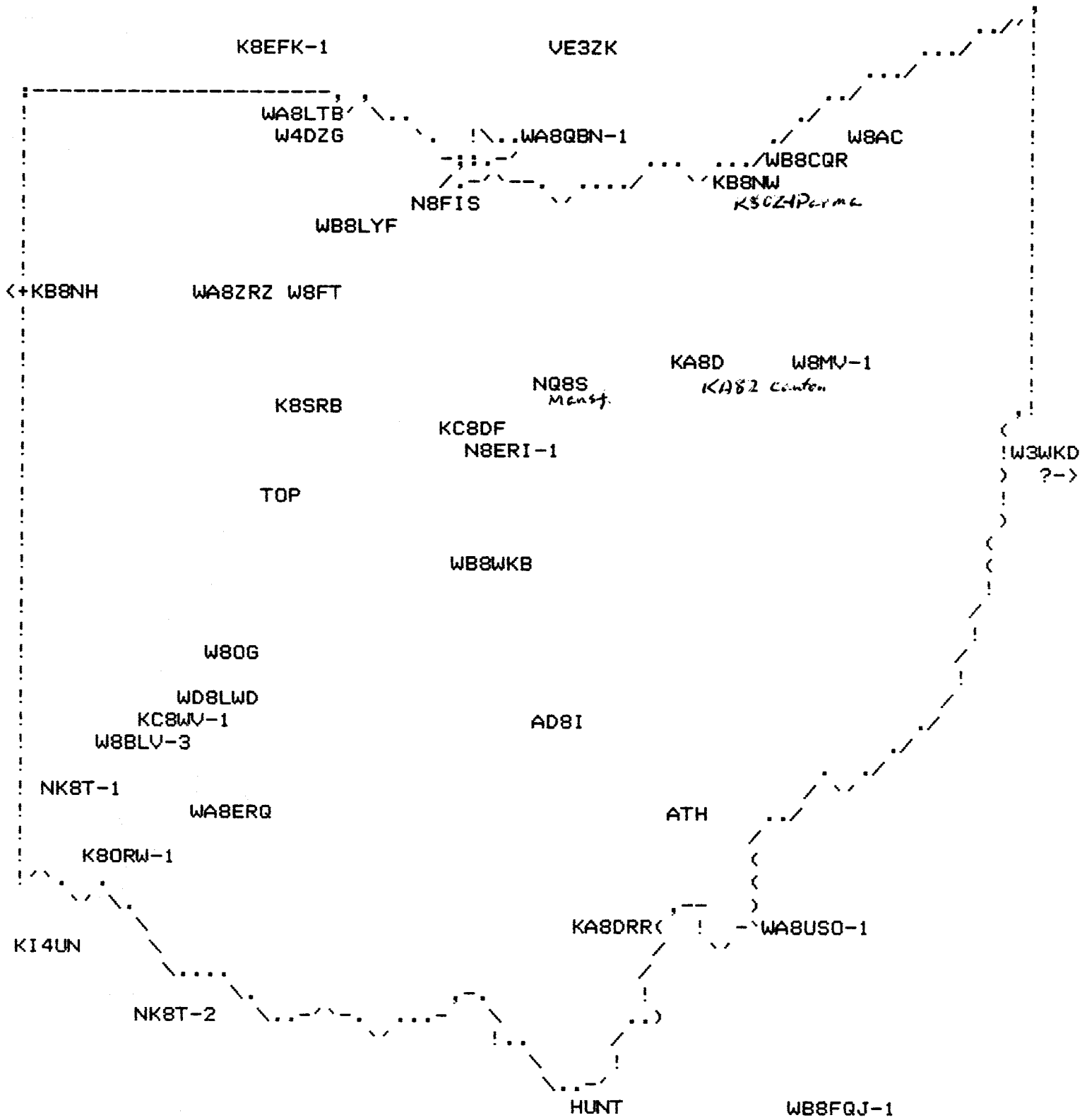
