TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS

Thanks to Paul, K1XM, the Yankee Clipper Contest Club, Gary, K4MQG, Wayne, KH6WZ, Bob, W5KNE, and QRZ DX for the following DX information.

CHAD. Carolina DX Association member Ken, WA4OBO, is on his way to Africa for two to three weeks. After a brief stop in France and Senegal, he will arrive in NDjamena, Chad, on November 10. Ken will be operating as T8OBO as his work schedule allows. He will be working with the government as an advisor to their cotton and textile industry. Ken has allocated several full days at the beginning and end of his stay for nothing but radio and will be on 80 through 10 meters on SSB only including the WARC bands. For CW buffs, Ken is trying to have other hams in Chad handle the CW operations using his call. Ken will have at least two stations for his use. One is in place in NDjamena. The other station is with one of the Americans there who does not have a license to operate. Additional rigs are being carried in. WA4UUP has furnished his Kenwood 450 and Yaesu is offering an FT990 to assist in the operation. INDEXA has furnished an SB220 amplifier and QSLs. QSL via WA4OBO. Current plans also call for a return trip to TT8 in February or March 1993. Time for plenty of DXing is being planned into the trip.

COCOS ISLAND. TI9JJP is active on SSB operating split. Check 14196, 14256, 21295 and 28495 kHz.

PITCAIRN ISLAND. Brian, VR6BX, is quite active. Check 14224 kHz at 0300z, 28425 kHz at 2230z, and RTTY around 21085 kHz at 0100z.

TROMELIN. FR5AI/T is on 28022 kHz between 12 and 1400z with a good signal into the eastern United States. He has been spotted on SSB around 14256 kHz.

MADAGASCAR. 5R8DE has been on 28495 kHz at 1900z. 5R8DF has returned to Japan.

TRINDADE ISLAND. Alberto, PYOTSN, prefers 14190 or 14195 kHz split operations from 23 to 0100z. Also look for him on 28490 kHz at various times between 12 and 1800z. QSL via PY3ASN.

SOUTH SHELAND ISLANDS. HFOPOL is active on 160 meters with a BIG signal. Check 1833 kHz between 0130 and 0230z. This operation is also on HF bands nearly every day. Check between 7010 and 7015 kHz from 01 to 0500z. There has also been some action on 3508 kHz, 20 and 10 meters.

MALAWI. 7Q7XX is very active on CW. Look for him any time the band is open to Africa. Good hunting on 10 meters is between 12 and 1500z, after which he often goes to 15 meters. Also check 7001 between 00 and 0300z.

BRITISH ANTARCTIC AREA. VP8ML, in the Falklands, has been active on 3800 kHz between 23 and 2400z. VP8GAV, in Antarctica, operates on 21020 kHz at 1930z, 28020 kHz at 1500z and 3506 kHz at 0200z. VP8CFM on South Orkney and VP8VN in the Falklands have been on 20 meter SSB between 00 and 0100z.

CURACAO. PJ2/OH6EI and PJ2/OH4EA are both very active. Check 1842 kHz and the bottom of 40 meters around 0100z.

EASTER ISLAND. The CEOY/SMOAGD, CEOY/LA7XB and CEOY/SMOOTG operation wraps up soon. QSL via their home calls. **SEYCHELLES.** K1XM and KQ1F will be active as S79S in the CQ World Wide CW Contest. Look for them on SSB and the WARC bands before and after the contest. QSL via KQ1F.

SAINT LUCIA. QSL information for the J68DX operations, as well as the FIRST satellite operation from this island, is as follows. J68DX and J68WZ via KH6WZ, J68AJ via KB6ZBL, J68MR via NI7T, and J68AP via KO1YF. J69BB satellite Qs via NI7T. For Qs with J69BB on all other modes, QSL via Rosemand Clery, PO Box 1809, Castries, Saint Lucia, West Indies. Satellite QSOs were also made by J68WZ and J68MR on SSB, and J68AP on CW. Special commemorative QSLs are being printed for both satellite and contest operations.

MONGOLIA. Special event station JUB30C will be active until December 31 to celebrate the 830th birthday of Chinghis Khan. JUB30C/3 will be active from the birthplace of Chinghis Khan sometime in November or December. QSL direct to JT1KAA, PO Box 639, Ulaanbaatar 13, Mongolia. JT1KAA also handles QSLs for contest stations JT1T and JU1T.

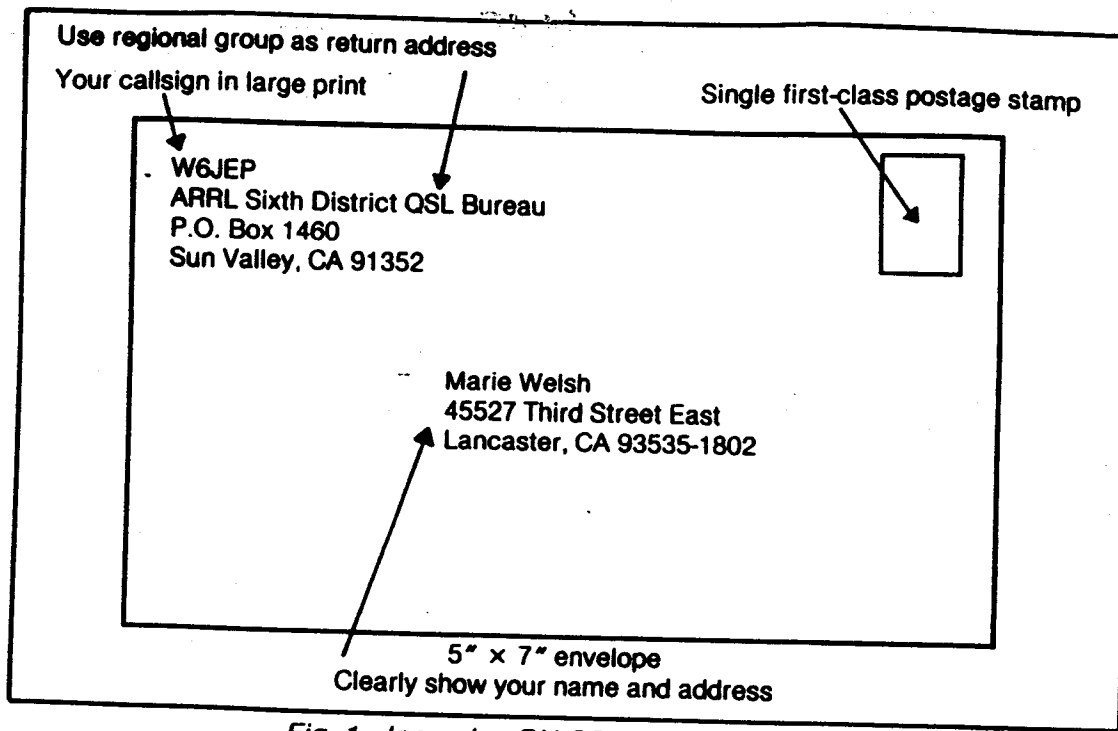


Fig. 1- Incoming DX QSL Bureau envelope.
