At our April club meeting we learned about emergency preparedness thanks to fellow ham Bob Knaack K8RDK, and Ken Roberts KC8BQO for getting us all better prepared. Bob explained the importance of good band and mode selection, taking notes, remembering alternate freqs. Watching 2 movies without falling asleep was a first for me, they were both filled with adventure and information. I have details on the Molex type connector that was discussed so that any of us could connect our radio to power supplied in an emergency command center, they are 8 amp connectors and fortunately Radio Shack sells them. The key is proper assembly, the part number is 274-222 (both halves in the package), the power supply end uses the male plastic connector with female metal inserts. The radio end uses the

larger female plastic half with the metal pin inserts, the pointed part becomes the red (+) terminal, the flat area is for black (-). This will help anyone as the packaging offers no pictorial view and the directions are very brief. For the purists the Molex style 1545

part numbers are 03-09-1021, 03-09-2022 for the plastic, 02-09-2103 and 02-09-1103 for the metal pins. April19th Roll Call

As of last week, all complaints filed through the telephone number will be acted on.

FLORIDA HAMS WARNED AFTER CUBAN COMPLAINTS

The FCC has followed up on malicious interference complaints from Cuban amateurs by sending Warning Notices to two Florida hams. The FCC letters, sent April 23 by Legal Advisor Riley Hollingsworth, K4ZDH, refer to monitoring information indicating the US hams deliberately attempted to jam 40-meter SSB net operations in Cuba.

The Federacion de Radioaficionados de Cuba (FRC), the national amateur organization in Cuba, first complained nearly two years ago to the International Amateur Radio Union, Region 2, about ongoing intentional interference by South Florida hams to Cuban nets and emergency operations. When the complaint was forwarded to the ARRL, Executive Vice President David Sumner, K1ZZ, responded with an expression of regret and a request that the FRC share any information that would help identify the perpetrators. Earlier this month, FRC General Secretary Oscar Morales, CO2OJ, was able to supply information that assisted in tentatively identifying two individuals believed to be involved in causing the interference.

Morales said that the Cuban nets have even tried moving to get away from the QRM, but the interfering stations have followed, at one point even jamming two frequencies at the same time.

Hollingsworth said he believes the interference has been on SSB by Spanish-speaking stations. The Cuban nets in question operate on frequencies that fall within the US Novice band, meaning that any US operation using more than 200 W PEP or operating SSB would be illegal. The US SSB subband begins at 7150 for Advanced and Extra class operators.

Hollingsworth has requested the two stations to respond to his letter within 20 days.

HAMS TO BE ON DAVID LETTERMAN SHOW

The ARRL is reporting that a group of hams from the Long Island Mobile Amateur Radio Club plans to be in the audience of the David Letterman show on Monday, May 3.

The group will have club and ARRL literature on hand, and will also raise the club banner. Members of the club who are planning on attending were told to wear their club name badges.

There is no word on whether or not Letterman has any of his "famous" canned hams ready for the group ... we will just have to watch and see.

Late Night with David Letterman is aired nationwide, usually following evening news broadcasts.

A reminder from the Coast Guard Auxiliary, get those life jackets out and make sure you wear them, the water in Lake Erie is about 50 F and that number holds special significance to mariners. When the water has warmed up to 50F you will have a 50 percent chance of swimming 50 feet without collapsing from hypothermia, don't let trouble catch you ahead of schedule.

I just took delivery on four excellent, watertight enclosures that will work out super for housing antenna relays, matching networks, stubs and filters, or a variety of necessities for the contest or high-performance station's antenna farm. \$29.97 plus shipping for all four.

These are high-impact, fiberglass 25mm ammo cases, built like the proverbial \$600 government toilet seat. Inside dimensions are 12 inches x 11 inches x 4 3/4 inches. 11 1/2 pounds each. Big enough for a large variable cap and roller inductor (AND a stepper-motor drive!), or perhaps a dozen or more UHF or N jacks and their remotely-operated relays. They open on each end and the lids are fully gasketed and cinch down tight with a stout cam and bail mechanism. These things look like the very pricey Pelikan (tm) cases, on steroids. Plenty of reinforcing ribs, but also enough flat surfaces for mounting things or cutting holes. About the only thing they won't be good for is RF shielding -- but this supplier has a variety of waterproof steel ammo cans for those that need metal shielding. Nice yellow stenciling on each side that says 20 cartridges, 25mm ammo (may work better than an anti-climb section on your tower!).

Call: The Sportsman's Guide at 1-800-888-3006 and ask for their latest sale catalog. The 25mm ammo cases are item J6-11260 for the four pack, or item J6-6534 for one at \$9.97 each
