The ARRL Ohio repeater council has allocated NOARS the frequencies 52.13/53.13 for a 6 meter repeater to be installed at the WEOL radio site. In 1996 Andy N8OFS and Clark N8PZD donated 4 repeaters for parts and 3 others have been acquired from sources for back-ups or to make it a split system. The antenna brackets and hardware have been built as of press time, the antenna came in Oct. 15th and will be raised as soon as possible. Xtals for the radio decks have been ordered and take 5 - 7 weeks for manufacturing, then after tuning the duplexing system the indoor equipment can be operated on-the-air, and the testing will begin. Digital signal processing, Virden "Clark" Beckman N8PZD


The ability to hear signals received in continuos wave or sidebands of amplitude modulation is dependent on the users hearing to pick out of the noise or other signals one which may sound strong or sharp to the human ear, being able to attenuate the adjacent noise is usually difficult. When you can shut down the background noise you will be able to hear the signal of choice easier, the ability to do this electronically is within reach using the components I found in National Semiconductors Linear applications handbook. The schematic I blended from 3 in the book, and my background with electronic experimenting, this idea started Autumn of 1995 and finally became operational after locating parts at Dayton Hamvention in 1996. After using at a ARRL Field Day I transplanted the unit into a metal housing with speaker to shield the audio amp from RF fields.

Components are available through several mail order sources or shopping in the radio amateur flea markets known widely as hamfests. Once you have obtained the parts construction should take a week if you devote 1 1/2 – 2 hours each day or evening. Enjoy building ... N8PZD
