Repeater Tips

(with many new operators coming on the bands it helps to run a few Repeater Tips to be helpful. Here are a few that are meant to be helpful and not critical)

1. Pause Between Exchanges; Someone with a high priority need for the repeater may want to break in, also, repeaters are constructed with a needed break between transmissions to reset the time-out timer.

2. Properly Identify; ID with your call at aprox. 10 minute intervals. You don't need to identify each and every transmission, unless you are experiencing a marginally dead battery or the end of the repeater's useful range while mobile.

3. Be Courteous; A repeater is like a telephone party line and requires the same kind of cooperation in it's use.

4. Don't Overpower The Repeater; This often distorts your signal and nobody can understand anything you have said.

5. Do Support Your Repeater; Installing and maintaining a good machine is an expensive undertaking – it costs thousands of dollars. Continual "deadbeats" are actually stealing other's time and investment in the repeater.

6. Don't Forget, Amateur Radio Exists Because It Is A Service, not just a hobby; Contribute to public service events including VHF FM communications, reporting roadway dangers and hazards as well as accidents.

7. Don't Monopolize A Repeater; Continue conversations but pause periodically to see if anyone else wants or needs to make a call or check if a net may be scheduled soon.

8. Don't Forget That What You Say Over A Repeater Can Be Heard Over Hundreds Of Square Miles; anyone with an inexpensive scanner or monitor unit may be listening. The good thing is they may like what they hear and become interested in license testing so they may join in. Don't leave bad impressions by making thoughtless or off color comments.

9. Don't Give Specific Locations; especially mobile, you may become victimized by a "hamburglar" listening in. The same warning applies to vacations, business trips, etc. It never hurts to say "Uncle Joe is watching the home qth" or your police dog doesn't travel with you. Of course if you are involved in an emergency situation you would need to be very specific about your location, try to remember main cross roads when relaying information on a telephone patch. The accident you just saw may be on a well marked route that traverses a whole county but without a reference point emergency services don't know where they are needed, think for a moment before describing the location on the air.

10. Don't Forget; N.O.A.R.S. encourages the use of it's repeaters. A repeater in use is one that is immediately ready for emergency calls. When a traveler or strange call is heard on the repeater, make them welcome or see if you can be of any help with local directions or points of interest.


