Radio operation aboard USS Cod SS224

Upon arriving at the submarine be certain you have parked in the correct portion of the auto lot, you should be in the most eastern section, depending on what time you leave you may encounter delays in the center or west sections. At the gate house let them know you are from NOARS and ask for the log book – the station door padlock is inside, once inside the radio room keep the key with the book to prevent lock-outs while using the restroom or taking a snack break outdoors. Operating the Drake TR7 is easy if you can see the display and knobs, at times the tuner dials and meter is hard to see with glare from other devices. Before testing transmissions be certain the antenna connecting cable is attached and the lead-in wire is removed from the submarine's original insulating block, this is a 4 foot long cable that is aprox 6 ft. from the galley hatchway door, it connects to the submarine just aft of the conning tower service stack. Once the antenna is correctly connected operating the tuner will be required if you move frequency more than 100 KC away from your original tuner settings, rough settings are in the front of the log book for 10, 15, 20, 30, and 40 MTRs – these will get you started, remember to stay with-in your licensed band priviledges or have a control operator to help you. When thing don't seem correct make a note in the log book and bring a note to a NOARS meeting, many operators keep another log sheet seperate from other operating logs so that they are able to QSL directly when something doesn't come thru as expected.

In response to Tedd KB8NW's demo on the packet DX cluster, here are common commands on a tear out A Brief Packet Cluster Tutorial – Adapted from the WU3V East Coast Megacluster

A cluster system is a DXer's desktop utility. The system has many commands to provide DX information, mail, bulletins/ files, and informational databases. You won't need to know all of them to make the network work for you. Following is a introduction to the ones a DXer should know to best benefit from a DX Cluster.

When you logged on you probably went through a registration dialogue asking for your name and QTH. If you were not and plan on returning to utilize the network, it is normally asked that you provide your name, QTH, and latitude/ longitude of your station. Here's how:

1. To enter your name, type SET/NAME [name], e.g. SET/NAME Chuck.

2. To enter your QTH (or full address/telephone), type SET/QTH [qth] as in this example: SET/QTH Kensington 20895, Montgomery County.

3. To use the features which give the DX station heading, and sunrise-sunset times, you need to enter your latitude and longitude. Enter for example, SET/LOCATION 39 2 N 77 7 W.

4. To verify the information entered, type in SHOW/STATION [yourcall], i.e. SHOW/STATION K2YMD. Using some other user's callsign, you can get their station information.

The most important item of the network is the sending and receiving of DX information. To see what DX has been sent, type SHOW/DX. This will list the last 5 DX announcements. If you're interested in one band, say 10 meters, type SHOW/DX 10. To find spots of a particular call, use: SHOW/DX [callsign], e.g. SHOW DX XZ1N. To send a DX announcement, the format is: DX [freq] [call] [comment-optional], e.g. DX 14223.4 VU2TTC -or- DX 28012.0 9X5AA QSL via W4FRU

Although examples here are given in UPPER CASE, lower case will work equally well.

Other primary commands are:

- * BYE or QUIT to log off the network *SHOW/WWV lists last 5 WWV solar flux reports
- * DIRECTORY or LIST lists last 5 (or more) mail messages since last checked
- * READ nbr reads that particular numbered mail message * READ reads mail messages addressed TO YOU
- * DELETE nbr deletes a mail message (to/from you) * SEND call send a mail message to someone (call) on system
- * SHOW/BULLETIN lists the directory of bulletin files * TYPE/BU filename reads the bulletin (filename) requested
- * SHOW/HEADING pfx gives the heading of the country prefix requested
- * SHOW/SUN pfx gives the sunrise/sunset of country prefix requested
- * TALK call msg. send a one-line message to someone (call) on system
- * SHOW/COMMAND lists the available information databases


