

Scholarship Plan Announced

THE FOUNDATION FOR AMATEUR RADIO, INC., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D.C., plans to administer fiftyfour (54) scholarships for the academic year 2006 - 2007 to assist licensed Radio Amateurs. The Foundation, composed of over seventy-five local area Amateur Radio Clubs, fully funds three of these scholarships. Ten are funded with the income from grants. The remaining forty-one (41) are administered by the Foundation without cost to the various donors. Licensed Radio Amateurs may compete for these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled in or have been accepted for enrollment at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$500 to \$2500 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas, or the pursuit of certain study programs. Clubs, especially those in Delaware, Florida, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin, are encouraged to announce these opportunities at their meetings, in their club newsletters, during training classes, on their nets and on their world wide web home pages. Additional information and an application form may be requested by letter or QSL card, postmarked prior to April 30, 2006 from: FAR Scholarships Post Office Box #831 Riverdale, MD. 20738

Pursuant to Article XI Titled: Changes to Constitution or Bylaws. Here are the proposed changes in the by-laws:

Original wording of Article III, paragraph 5. Titled: Special Life Member:

- 5. Special Life Member
 - a) Members may be honored by election to Special Life Membership when nominated by the board of directors and confirmed by affirmative vote of the members present at a regular club meeting.
 - b) Special Life Members will have the same obligations and privileges as defined above except the obligation to pay dues is <u>recanted.</u>

(end of paragraph 5)

Changes proposed are in the form of an addendum shown below:

- 5. Special Life Member
 - a) Members may be honored by election to Special Life Membership when nominated by the board of directors and confirmed by affirmative vote of the members present at a regular club meeting.
 - b) Special Life Members will have the same obligations and privileges as defined above except the obligation to pay dues is <u>recanted.</u>
 - c) Automatic Special Life membership. Members meeting the following eligibility requirement will be automatically promoted to special life membership with the same obligations and privileges spelled out in paragraph 5-b
 - 1) requirements of eligibility: at age 75 or will turn 75 during the current year. And who have five (5) years consecutive membership in good standing immediately prior to the year of eligibility.
 - 2) It will be the duty of the membership committee to notify the candidate of such promotion. And to modify the membership records to reflect the change.

(End of paragraph 5)

What happens next? The proposed changes will be voted on at the January 16th 2006 meeting and if carried will become an addendum to our bylaws. And the revised paragraph will be published in the following issue of the log (pursuant to article XI of the bylaws titled: Changes to Constitution or Bylaws)





ANTARCTICA NEWS - Horacio, LU4DXU, will operate as LU4ZS from Marambio Base (IOTA AN-013, Antarctica Award LU-03) on Seymour Island from January 3-8th, if everything works out with "logistical transport". Alan Cheshire, VP8PJ (aka VK6CQ, VK0LD, and 9V1DX), is active until around January 30th from Patriot Hills Base Camp in Ellsworth Land, Antarctica (80 Deg South 81 Deg West, about 700 miles south of Peter 1st Island). His main activity will be CW on 7003, 10103, 14003; SSB depending on propagation. He was heard this past week on 40 meters between 0200-0330

C6, BAHAMAS - Bill, KM1E, is active as C6AGN from Green Turtle Cay (NA-080), Little Bahama Bank, until March 8, 2006. Activity will be on all HF bands. QSL via his home callsign.

E2/HS, THAILAND (Scout Activity) - Look for special event station E25AJ to be active during the 25th Asia-Pacific Scout Jamboree from Hat Yao, Thailand, between now and January 3rd. Activity will be on all bands (no WARC) on CW, SSB, RTTY, PSK, SSTV and Satellite.

IOTA NEWS - AF-032. (Update) Members of the Provins ARS (F6KOP) will be active as 5H1C from Zanzibar Island, January 24th to February 2nd. Their activity will be on 160-10 meters, CW, SSB and digitals (PSK, RTTY, SSTV). It was announced this past week, that the F6KOP members agreed to try to take skeds for 160/80 meters only.
