Name Change For NOARS Winterfest!

Some of you may have noticed that we renamed our winter hamfest. It is now know as "NOARS WinterHamFest" and here's the reason why.

Around January 17th we received correspondence from the President of "The Vienna Wireless Society" based in Vienna, VA. Demanding that we no longer use the word "Winterfest" for our winter event, or pay them a annual licensing fee. As they apparently registered the word "Winterfest" as their own. In the form of a "service mark" thus giving them Exclusive rights to that word.

After lengthy consideration and taking the advise from our friends at the league. The hamfest and executive committee(s) decided that in the spirit of the hamradio fraternity that in order not to cause the Vienna Wireless Society any more concern we've renamed the 2006 event the "NOARS WinterHamFest".

NOARS had the word "Winterfest" registered here in Ohio not with the intent to prevent the use of the word or sell licensing fees. But to protect our use of the word. But since then has allowed the registration to expire

A recent search of the internet yielded of 1.75 million instances of that word being used by one entity or another for various different events.
