You will be required to bring your own writing materials and note paper. The only other cost to get your license is the testing fee which is \$14 whether you pass the test or not. If you fail the test and wish to retake it, another \$14 fee will be charged. We will have details about taking your test at the class.

From the east via I-480: Proceed on I-480 west to SR 10 Norwalk. SR 10 becomes SR 20. Exit at SR 301 South (LaGrange Rd. exit). Turn right onto LaGrange Rd. heading north. At Oberlin-Elyria Rd., turn left, proceed on Oberlin-Elyria Rd approximately ¼ mile to Russia Rd. Turn right onto Russia Rd. heading west. Airport is approximately two miles on right.

From the east or west via the Ohio Turnpike: Turnpike exit 140, State Route 58. Exit southbound on route 58. Cross over Rt. 113; continue south to next stop light. Make a left turn onto Russia Road. Airport is 2 miles on your left.

From the east or west via I-90: Exit at SR 58. Take SR 58 south to Russia Rd. (approximately 6 miles). Turn left onto Russia Rd. heading east. Airport is approximately one mile on left.

Once arrived at the Airport: Enter the main entrance, Approach the gate and press the button that says press here to enter. (The secretary can't open the gate unless you press the button). When asked what you are here for just say you are here for Civil Air Patrol and they should let you in. (Call us at the CAP Squadron Phone Number at 440-284-9805 if you have problems at the gate). After the gate to your

right there will be an Air force sign that says Civil Air Patrol Turn Right at the sign. Go to the Last office on the back side of the main Hanger. That is our office. It is marked by the red white and blue 30 foot radio tower next to our headquarters.
