HP2/3E2, PANAMA (IOTA Op?) -- Two members of the Uruguay DX Group, Bert/CX3AN and Mario/CX4CR, will be traveling to Panama, June 22-28th. Operators will sign as HP2/homecall (or possibly as 3E2/homecall) from San Blas Archipelago (NA-170). Activity will be on 80-6 meters CW/SSB using 500W into a vertical/wires antennas. They informed OPDX that this Caribbean DXpedition is to celebrate Bert becoming "DXCC NUMBER ONE" after working BS7H. This will be their 15th country from five different continents they activated over past 20 years.

IOTA NEWS -- EU-060. Operators SV2FPU, SV2HNZ, SV2HOB, SV2HPP, SV2HPY, SV2HRT, SV2HSV and SV2GNQ will be active as SY8WT from Skyros Island between June 16-22nd. 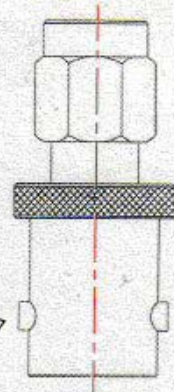

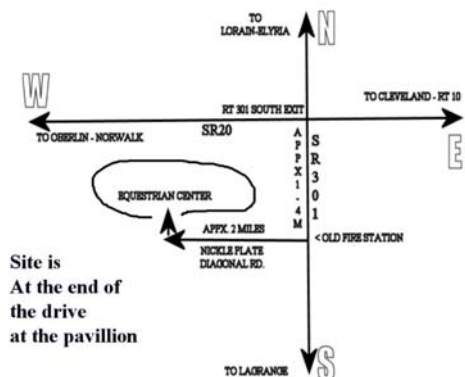
