- **5Z, KENYA (IOTA Op)** -- Antonio, IK8VRH, will be active as 5Z4/IK8VRH from Malindi, time permitted, in August. Operations will be from the Coast Province North Group (AF-Ø4Ø) between August 15-17th and the Coast Province South Group (AF-Ø67) between August 2Ø-22nd. Enrico, 5Z4ES, will be with him. Activity will be on 4Ø/2Ø/17 meters using CW/SSB/RTTY. Equipment will be a FT45ØAT with a Sommerkamp 3ØØwatt PA, Bubbledipole, Zx Mini Beam,-USB II MicroHAM and MiXW.
- LIGHTHOUSE ACTIVITY -- Operators Doug/KD8CAO and John/K8YSE will activate the Grand Haven South Pierhead Inner (USA-1Ø77) and Grand Haven South Pierhead Outer (USA-1Ø78) Michigan Lighthouses during the ARLHS 2ØØ8 National Lighthouse-Lightship Week, August 2-9th. Operation from Grand Haven will be on August 2nd. On August 3d, they will try to activate other Lake Michigan lighthouses. Look for them on all HF bands. Satellite operations on AO-51, SO-5Ø and AO-27 are a possibility. QSL via K8YSE.
- MJ, JERSEY -- . Operators Oliver/OE5OHO, Henry/OE5HDN and Gerhard/OE3GEA will be active as MJ/homecall between August 21-26th. Activity will be holiday style with operations on all HF bands on CW and SSB. QSL via the Bureau to their home callsigns.
- **SMITHSONIAN STATION GOING QRT** -- \ "The Daily DX" reports: "The Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History Amateur Radio station NN3SI will be going QRT on July 31st. The club has been trying for several months to come up with a solution to keep this icon on the air. Annually the museum has three million visitors, many getting a first time exposure to Amateur Radio. NN3SI has been QRV for the last 32 years. Starting today through the end of the month the station will be active before finally shutting down. Starting around 1315z, activity will begin on 4Ø meters. Watch the following frequencies for possible activity: 384Ø, 724Ø, 1424Ø, 2134Ø and 2844Ø kHz (+/-). They may also be on PSK." QSL info and more details are available at: http://www.grz.com/NN3SI

The Big Change, Analog to Digital Television, Part 2...The Converter Box

FIRST if you use CABLE on ALL your TV sets, YOU DO NOT NEED a converter box! If you have ANY TV using an ANTENNA read on. There is a lot to learn for those folks who use antennas to receive Television signals on any TV they own! Do you have Cable but also have a small portable TV you use in the kitchen or outside or in the garage, etc.? REMEMBER if you intend to use any TV with an ANTENNA and not with CABLE, you will need a converter box to change the Digital signals that will fill the airwaves next FEBRUARY 17th, as the government's mandatory change to Digital will be in force. Low power stations (such as Channels 29, 35 and others) will be exempt from the change to Digital at least for now and MAY remain Analog. These low power stations will be the only ones you will be able to view without Cable or a Converter Box and an antenna after next February.

For those using an antenna and needing a converter box, first ask for a government money saving coupon! This coupon will save you \$4Ø.ØØ off of SOME of the available boxes. Go to DTV.GOV for more information on how to request one or two coupons for your household. Two is the maximum the government will send to each home address WHILE THEY LAST. These coupons look like a credit card, can only be used once and only for APPROVED converters. The key here is, of the many converter boxes available, only a few are approved for the coupon discount. I understand the government can't keep up with all the new units becoming available and in need of testing. Sadly there are also scams out there on the internet and elsewhere. I am not saying avoid the internet, just be CAREFUL. We had a story last week about an internet seller with FREE boxes NO coupon needed! All you had to do was send \$59.95 for a warranty plus shipping. The moral here is getting an approved converter from a reputable dealer.

I have tested several converter boxes available locally and some antennas as well. I find they all work, some better than others. Some have more bells and whistles or are easier to use. Some are more sensitive (able to "find" more stations) than others and so on. For \$5Ø.ØØ minus the \$4Ø.ØØ government discount coupon plus tax on \$5Ø.ØØ (yes, that is how they do it) or a total of less than \$14.ØØ out of your POCKET, you can get a bare bones no frills plastic Magnavox converter with remote at Wal-Mart, OR the same box or a pass thru model at K-Mart, OR an Access model at B&B Appliance. The Access is new to me.

For about \$6Ø.ØØ minus coupon plus tax, you will find a digital stream box at Radio Shack. This is a good basic box with a superior tuning meter, good sensitivity and passes thru function. The drawback is a confusing remote and hard to navigate menu at first.

At Best Buy you will find an Apex pass thru box (sorry I have not tested this one as yet). They also have an Insignia brand box from LG. The Insignia is another good solid performer and this company reportedly holds patents on some of the circuitry used in many other boxes. (LOOK carefully for a manufacture date after Dec. 2ØØ7). SOME units made before this date had sound problems that have been corrected in later units.

At B&B Appliance, Circuit City and H. H. Gregg, another good choice is the Zenith box. This one appears to be a near clone of the Insignia and just as good a performer. At last check, B&B also sells a Philco pass thru box. Since these sell out quickly, I have not been able to test this one either.

You may be asking, what is "Pass Thru"? Pass thru refers to a converter that will EASILY bypass the electronics in the box so you can view the low power stations that will stay analog for now and not need converting.

Bottom line is, if you want an inexpensive basis converter box that works okay without frills, Wal-Mart, K-Mart or B&B Appliance have what you want. If you want a bit better model with better sensitivity (to "find" more stations) with or without pass thru and more than one model to look at, B&B Appliance or Best Buy may be good for you. Everyone else is somewhere in between.

A look at antennas. I am having good luck with an 8 bay bow tie UHF antenna right now. This COULD change next year when Channels 8 and 19 will remain on VHF with their digital signals. We may want to wait until then to change and/or upgrade our antennas. Today there are some problems with digital Channel 3 because it is very low in frequency and requires a larger antenna than anyone else. If you cannot wait until next February to view Channel 3 perfectly, you could purchase a TERK brand or other Loaded Dipole (rabbit ear) antenna to improve this hard to get Digital signal. Problems with the Channel 3 and Channel 25 digital signals will be greatly reduced or eliminated next year when they will be using new high power transmitting gear and new antennas. Both stations will be on UHF. Channel 25 will also move its signal to the WKYC DT3 site on Broadview Road.

Smart antennas -- The main function of this "Smart" technology is that it electronically rotates the antenna for the best performance. The Smart antennas DO NOT change or peak for a specific frequency or physically move. Most models of the Smart antenna tested worked very well. The Channel Master Smart antenna does not work the same way as the others so it can't be compared fairly. The better smart antennas work along with a dedicated control box or control box/converter. There is also a stand alone unit that works well but is a bit light for outdoor use. Smart antennas tested are from General Electric, Sylvania/Fun and Channel Master. The General Electric Box and antenna is a great combination with the Sylvania next. At this time none of these box/antenna combinations appear to be available other than on the internet and few can be purchased with the discount coupon. For those who want the best performance possible without buying an HDTV, many retailers offer Digital RECEIVERS with all kinds of outputs like S Video, Optical, HDMI and some have USB for connection to your computer monitor for great Digital TV on a budget!

Please be aware this information is constantly changing. What is available today may not be next week and something new is coming soon to be sure. These are only helpful hints and no promises are made as to what will work at your home or business. Stop by a local retailer and see the equipment and learn more about this big change in Television.
