Northern Ohio Digital Interconnect Group & W1AW / ARRL Join Forces to Further D-STAR Awareness

Lorain County Ohio – The Northern Ohio Digital Interconnect Group has finalized an agreement with W1AW & the ARRL to provide a base of operations for D-STAR testing, demonstration & awareness.

This base will be Reflector 038 Charlie which is currently the home of the Dayton Hamvention as well as several other large venue hamfests. Dayton Hamvention, W1AW along with other hamfests will share the reflector as its primary users.

Giving W1AW a base of operation allows them to demonstrate the capabilities of D-STAR for visitors and allows for a known global contact point for the station. It will also provide a stable platform for testing and training as required.

D-STAR has made tremendous gains in popularity and has truly risen to the top as a viable and reliable communication avenue to augment the existing Ecomm communities' modes of operation. It provides voice, asset management & location as well as high and low speed data transfer and is more spectrally efficient than other modes. It also allows a Ham not able to operate HF the ability to talk globally from an HT on minimum power.

- **5X, UGANDA (Update), Freddy, F5IRO/J28RO**, who is here on a work assignment through June, has applied for the callsign 5X5RO, with the help of David, 5X1D (KH9AE), and is now active. Freddy states, "The station is quite ready to be set up; just some work on the vertical antenna to finish it." His station is a Elecraft K3 using verticals or dipoles. Activity will be on CW on the upper HF bands, especially on 10 MHz in the evening (5X = GMT + 3) and possibly some PSK operations. Watch the DXClusters for spots. He was spotted on 30 and 15 meters this past week (21013 and 10131 kHz). QSL is via Michel, F8DFP, by the French Cureau or direct (w/SAE and IRC). - **D2, ANGOLA**, Craig, MM0SSG, is now active as D2SG from Luanda and will be there until around October 31st.
