- K2, UNITED STATES (Special Event) The 4th annual "Original 13 Colonies Independence Week Special Event", which begins 12:Ø1 AM Eastern (Ø4Ø1Z), on July 1st, (That's one minute after midnight, early Sunday morning, July 1st) to 11:59 PM Eastern (Ø359Z July 6th) ending on July 5th (One minute to midnight, late Thursday night, July 5th). Recognizing that "Independence Day" (July 4th) comes in the middle of the week (Wednesday) and that some operators will be going to their work on the 2nd, 3rd and 5th, they have added a BONUS DAY on Saturday, June 3Øth, 2Ø12!! Stations will operate from Ø9:ØØ AM Eastern (13ØØZ) right through until the 5th. Keep in mind that there may be fewer operators available on the work days, so PLEASE BE PATIENT! There will be at least two S.E. stations per colony state. Also included will be Super contest stations, multi-operator Club stations, and OM & XYL teams.
