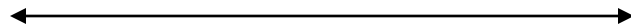

New Amateur Radio Group Announced! Contributed by: Jeff KB8ZUN

Lorain County Wireless Operators Mission Statement:

"Lorain County Wireless Operators was formed in an effort to advance amateur radio in the Great Lakes and surrounding areas. LCWO's four core operators simply want grow amateur radio by showcasing all that Ham Radio has to offer while maintaining the highest operational standards. LCWO will maintain these standards on and off the air promoting a positive, productive, environment. LCWO will be complimented by Guest Operators who have experience in specialized areas of operation and show a high regard for the art. The operators will focus their on the air time in unique areas bringing the public's attention to amateur radio by operating special events stations and also contesting as well as supporting & promoting area clubs & public service groups. Our call, NW8S, will support LOTW, eQSL and direct QSL during all events. We will utilize all segments of the spectrum; HF, VHF, UHF, SHF, along with existing and experimental modes. We hope that our efforts to further amateur communications will inspire others to become licensed or more active in a hobby that can be very rewarding and satisfying. Regardless if it's talking across town on a local repeater, traffic handling, severe weather, providing relief communications after a disaster or making a new friend in a far away country using Morse Code or a cutting edge mode yet invented LCWO believes there is something for everyone." Meetings are held as needed in support of the activities currently underway as well as future events. These meetings are limited to the core group as well as those involved in a specific event. For instance the United States Coast Guard, Lorain Port Authority, the Lighthouse Foundation, ILLW, legal counsel and LCWO all took part in the lighthouse planning and execution meetings. All interested in amateur radio are considered members and encouraged to participate. In fact we ask that anyone who has an idea for operation bring it to the table. We may limit participation and input from individuals or groups if it is counterproductive, in poor taste, of a political agenda, or generally destructive to amateur radio, clubs or agencies. There are no dues. LCWO and its partners will fund each event as needed. An event team will typically share in the expense of any given project. A person's inability to financially support a project will not limit them from participating or being a planning / execution team member. Outside financial support is encouraged and supported but will not be accepted with an agenda. LCWO is able to bring time, resources and relationships to the table in an effort to execute projects normally out of reach. Working outside the politics and structure of clubs gives us latitude to move more freely and respond quicker. This should NOT be viewed as negativity toward clubs. All LCWO founders belong to at least one club and in several cases many. We are members and financially support NOARS, LCARA, NODIG, the PAPA System and the ARRL to name a few. We recognize there absolutely is a need and function for the clubs. This is really just about having fun and moving amateur radio forward without the baggage of other venues. I think we all can appreciate the need and desire for that! As for scheduled events, there are roughly a dozen projects on the table. Stay tuned!

He will focus on stations from DL, HB0, HB9 and OE, as well as on North and South America. QSL via his home callsign, direct or by the Bureau. Also, LoTW and eQSL.
- **9/11 SPECIAL EVENT STATIONS** ~ * Members of the Symbol Technologies Amateur Radio Club (STARC), will be operational as N1Y, September 8th and 9th. Activity is commemorating the September 11th, 2001, terrorist attacks. They will be operating on 40/20/15 meters using CW and SSB, in the "General" portions of the bands.
