Speaking of fun the youth repeater net is now on it's way to compete with the longest running repeater net in this area, the NOARS Wednesday Ragchew net on 146.70, with the variation of things we talk about on-theair it is anyone's guess why this idea did not take off years ago, with the merging of the internet/echolink this is surely going to put more voices out there sharing ideas about ways to make schoolwork interesting, remember when you could hardly use the phone because our kids were talking about fashion at the next school function or football game? Let them run the repeater net and ask for help when they think they want some, more time to tend to gardening and those nagging home repairs.

Unfortunately as we moved into the repeater linking project we found nearly every piece of this equipment had failed in one way or another so every step forward became 2 or 3 steps backward, along with burnt circuit boards in the 444.8Ø repeater where the link equipment would be connected so this project has been in slow motion the last few months sorting parts and making repairs, tower service is needed at Elyria on both top antennas as well. The Elyria switching power supply has been holding up well during repeater nets, several were put into service at the 145.15 site with the same success, however roof repairs at the apartment site have been delayed by rain so no new antenna experiments up there until these guys have finished, I have been in contact with the old site to visit and measure for putting up a back-up station in that location.

My tube radio drifts around a little so that makes it interesting, but I hear the 15mtr band opening now from eastern Europe so I look forward to adding a few new ones waiting for the leftovers of hurricane Sandy to hit the great lakes and mix with the cold from the north.
