Excerpts from QRP Presentation at March meeting – Joe Oney – KD8MCN By KE4SJC – Rudy

"I've been doing QRP for about six months", quipped Joe Oney. "It started with me and a buddy doing CW. Our skills were such that we really didn't want to be heard and the only way to do that was to reduce power."

If the question is, should you reduce power? The answer is yes. CFR Part 97 § 97.313 (a) transmitter power standards states:

"An amateur station must use the minimum transmitter power necessary to carry out the desired communications." QRP means transmitting at 5 watts or less. "If a transmitter is capable of transmitting at 100 watts", Joe queried, "why wouldn't one use the full power to QSO?"

Joe then offered several reasons for reducing power including concern for the RF environment, not wanting to be heard, or the fact that reduced power just plain works.


