Proposed changes to the By-Laws:

In accordance with Article IX (A), (C), (D) of the By-Laws, to wit,

- A) The proposed change must be published in the newsletter prior to the next regular business meeting and must be read to the members prior to voting.
- C) For a change in By-Laws an affirmative vote to two-thirds of those voting at one meeting is necessary for adoption.
- D) The change as accepted will be published in the next newsletter.

Proposed changes (in red/crossed out) to Article VIII –Election of Officers (B)(3) – Balloting Procedures:

3. Balloting Procedure

- a. At the October meeting the President shall appoint an election committee, consisting of not less than four or more than seven members, whose duties shall be to prepare, mail, collect, verify identity, and tally ballots. This committee is automatically dissolved when the election is finalized.
- b. A ballot package will be mailed to each voting member within one week after the October meeting. Each ballot package will consist of:
- 1. A ballot with all nominees listed
- 2. A plain unmarked envelope
- 3. An addressed return envelope with the member's call printed on the inside of the envelope.
- b. An election ballot package will be created and attached to the November newsletter and posted on the NOARS website making it available to each voting member. The election ballot package will contain the following information:
- 1. The ballot with all office positions.
- 2. Nominees listed for each position.
- c. Each voter will clearly mark his ballot and seal it in the unmarked envelope. The unmarked envelope will then be sealed in the addressed envelope and mailed back to the election committee.
- c. Election ballots will be accepted in one of the following ways:
- 1. Sealed in an unmarked envelope. The unmarked envelope placed in an addressed envelope with the members call sign printed on the inside of the addressed envelope and mailed back to the election committee at the predetermined postal address.
- 2. Present the ballot in person to the election committee at the November regular business meeting.
- d. The election committee will make a final pickup of ballots from the official predetermined postal address on the day of the regular business meeting in November as late in the day as is practical. NO FURTHER MAIL-IN BALLOTS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- e. Any member not wishing to mail in his ballot may turn it in to the election committee at the November business meeting.
- f. Those members who did not receive a ballot package will have a ballot package made available to them at the November meeting.
- g. It is the responsibility of the election committee to verify that each member casts only one ballot.
- h. The first order of business, under new business, at the November meeting shall be the final call for ballots by the election committee. After all ballots are received the chairperson shall declare that voting is officially over. No further ballots will be accepted.
