A Memorial to the Last Ham

Forward

The original version of this story presented here was related to me by a friend who read it in a long-forgotten ham publication many years ago. Since I don't remember all the facts presented in the original publication, the story presented here is my version. I was delighted by the original version and hope you will find the version presented here enjoyable.

This story takes place in the future, at which time the amateur radio service no longer exists because people evolved to the point where they could communicate long distances by employing mental telepathy. After many years, the last ham on Earth, although not active, passed away and a museum wanted to erect an exhibit to honor the passing of the last ham. The operator was preserved and exhibited sitting in a chair, wearing earphones and leaning slightly over a desk with one

hand resting on a microphone and the other hand touching the tuning knob of a transceiver. Also present on the desk was an antenna tuner, a three-position antenna switch, a SWR/power meter, a straight key and an ancient ARRL Handbook. The wall was adorned with a DX world map and QSL Cards. A sign identified the exhibit as "A HAM STATION OF YORE."

A majority of the museum's board of directors objected to the wording on the exhibit. They argued that station should be in Latin so as to give the exhibit a touch of elegance and suggested the sign state the exhibit is a typical ham radio installation and the operator is deceased. The next day, the original sign was replaced by the newly-revamped sign in Latin proclaiming the exhibit "A TYPICAL HAMUS EXTINCTUS."
