













From the Binder

July 2019

Mike Bokulich, K8US, lent us a binder full of NOARS newsletters from various months, mostly from 1977 through 1980. Also included in the binder were rosters and a list of past Presidents. This is a treasure trove, considering that the online newsletters go back only to 1982. We will be publishing occasional tidbits gleaned from the binder.

From the binder we learn that NOARS was founded 55 years ago, in 1964, by "13 active amateurs who desired to form a social-type club fitting their interests." The first President was Joe Simsic, W8OHN. Some of our members may remember him.

A scan of the rosters and mastheads of the newsletters reveal some familiar names, including Neal Hubbard, WD8NZR, and Harold Drake, WD8OFG. They were listed

as new hams in the October 1977 newsletter. Harold's current call sign is K8HRD. Names in the 1976, 1977 and 1978 rosters, familiar to this editor are: Dan, K8AGW; Tom, W8KYZ; Mike, formerly K8SJU, currently K8US; Charlie, formerly WD8EBQ, currently K8AGV; Carl, W8KRF; Joe, W8GWD. Ned Jones, WD8CSP was Secretary and Ray Becker, KA8BPU was Club Property Manager, according to the masthead in the 1983 issue.

In 1976 a special event was held at Midway Mall to show the public what ATV, HF and RTTY were all about. Reps from the American Red Cross, seeing the demo of message handling, asked that the hams find information concerning a train wreck "somewhere in Ohio." The hams located the wreck in East Liverpool, amazing and pleasing the Red Cross, especially since it took less than 90 minutes. Carl, W8KRF, was at the event. He "brought and operated his fantastic Yaesu Twins." Below is a photo of young Carl, W8KRF, at the event.



Social Committee - Elaine, KC8FOS. The Annual Picnic will be August 19. Other possible events are trips to Amish country, a casino and Niagara Falls. We have social events so we can get together and talk and know each other better. The NOARS monthly lunch will be Tuesday, July 2 at Golden Corral in Elyria at noon. Everyone is welcome.

NOARSfest – Carl. NOARSfest will be Saturday, July 20. Carl invited the Makers Alliance to participate. They accepted the invitation of have a table. Ham radio and makers go together. The person Carl contacted is a ham. John Baddour, a member of NOARS and a leader in Boy Scouts, will be contacted about having Boy Scouts at a table at NOARSfest. Bill, K2WJS, agreed to contact him, but cautioned the hamfest is the last day of camp so it is uncertain if scouts will be able to attend.
