QLF OM?

Forward

Just a few remarks concerning the cryptic title. QLF is an offshoot of a group of 65 codes which consisted of two letters preceded by a Q. The purpose was to reduce the time required to transmit a CW message. For example, "Who is calling me?" would be QRX in Q code. QSY is the Q code for "shifting frequency." Q codes were employed by the railroad telegraphy system, hams and later in international communications where two operators of different languages could communicate (QSO) for business purposes or ham contacts. Abbreviations were also employed for the identical purpose as the Q code. OM is the abbreviation for "old man" and refers to a male operator of any age, YL refers to a young lady regardless of age, and XYL refers to a married lady. Modern *ARRL Handbooks* do not contain a Q code list, but do contain an abbreviation list, while the old handbooks of

yesteryear did contain a partial Q code list.

It is reputed that the text that appears in the title of this article was the first message transmitted by a young Thomas Edison during his first day as a railroad telegrapher. The seasoned telegraphers were going to show this young upstart a thing or two about telegraphy and a high-speed operator began sending at a rate near the upper limit of the telegraph system. Being a perfectionist, Edison copied the text 100%; when the operator requested a reply, he responded with "QLF OM?," which inquired, "Are you sending with the left foot, old man?"

QLF was never an official Q code.
