The tour was informative and engaging. You will notice a photo of radio gear that is still used in the event of a digital equipment failure. Radio is still involved!














WSJT-X Audio File Save Bug

Summary


WSJT-X creates temporary audio files with the file extension of .wav and sometimes does not delete them when it is done with them. This will slowly eat up your disk space if these temporary files are never deleted. To delete them using WSJT-X, just click the **File** menu then click on **Delete all *.wav & *.c2 files in SaveDir**. If you have a lot of files this will take a long time.



Details for the Curious

The files are stored in a directory path:


C:\Users\tom\AppData\Local\WSJT-X\save. Note that
the directory **tom** will be a different name on your
machine based on your Windows Username (unless your
Username is tom). Also note that the AppData directory
is hidden, so you must set File Explorer to show hidden
files and folders.



In Windows lingo a directory and a folder are the same thing. Usually using the GUI it is called a folder but using the console windows it is referred to as a directory. When I looked in the directory on my machine it had thousands of files and it took 30 minutes for the system to delete them all and it freed up 13 Gigabytes of disk space.

In researching this bug, I found a helpful document by Robert C. Mazur, VA3ROM at http://www.va3rom.com/docs/WSJT-X Audio File Save Problem and Fix.pdf. Robert made a valuable suggestion.

Make sure you have Save turned off (set to None). Click on the Save menu and then click None
