Membership Meeting Minutes February 17, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by President Carl, W8KRF. Twenty-four members and one guest were in attendance.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited, followed by roll call by call sign. Tom, W8KYZ, welcomed Scott, KE8NTW, who will join the club tonight. This was his first time at a NOARS meeting.

Al, N8CX, made a motion to accept the minutes of the January meeting, as they are printed in the NOARS Log. Bob, W8NNC, seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report - Tom, W8KYZ, related account balance. Expenses for the past 30 days included Windstream, start-up money for the Winter Hamfest, and a memorial contribution to Lakeshore United Methodist Church for Mark, K8WON. Ann, KA8ZEP, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by Roger, AB8IF. The motion passed.

Tom, W1PDI had NOARS brochures updated and printed. Cost is \$301. No line-item for it in budget. Carl, W8KRF, made a motion to pay the cost of printing. Chet, K8KIZ seconded. Discussion asked for. Elaine, KC8FOS, pointed out \$301 is a small amount when considering the total balance in the club's finances.

Raffle tickets for the 50/50 drawing were discussed. Dave, KY8OSU, reminded members that tickets are also being handed out at each meeting. These should be kept for a drawing at the 2020 Holiday Banquet. The winner will receive a new HT.

Parliamentary Committee – Tom, N8FDY. No report.

Club Property - Tom, W1PDI. Banners from the last hamfest were briefly discussed. Location of ARRL banners is uncertain, Carl, W8KRF says me may have them.

Field Day - Al, N8CX. We will join with LCARA again. Prefield Day will be Saturday, June 13. Bring any computers that will be used for logging so everything can be tested. Field Day will be June 27.

Social Committee - Elaine, KC8FOS. The March Monthly Meal will be on Tuesday, March 3 at noon at the Golden Corral in Elyria, April meal will be Tuesday, April 7. All are welcome. Social Committee will meet soon to plan events mentioned at previous meetings, such as fox hunt and antenna day in the park.

Program Committee - Elaine, KC8FOS. March 9 program reviewed by Bob, W8NNC. Keith McCormick is a retired 747 airline captain. He will talk about HF radio and how it was used in aircraft. Note: meeting will be March 9. April program will be Tony Emanuele, speaking on earth-moon-earth communications. Roger displayed and briefly talked about his current homebrew project. And invited all to look at it after the meeting.

Winter Hamfest - Carl, W8KRF. Sunday, March 1. Signup sheet was passed around. An MC is needed. Twenty-four tables are reserved so far. Jack, N8NDL will have a table and prizes to donate. Carl is taking reservations for sales tables. Let him know if you would like a table.

New Business – Carl, W8KRF. Changes to the club's constitution need to be voted on tonight, including makeup of the Board. Nine board members changed to seven, being four current officers, most recent past president, and two full members from the general membership. If there is a vacancy on the Board after appointments are made, the President may appoint a full member to serve for not more than two years. Appointments will be commensurate with the President's term of office. Officers are elected annually in accordance with Article 7 of the current Bylaws. One-year term changed to two-year term.

Changes to the bylaws, to be voted on at the next meeting: Automatic life membership – the duty of the Membership Committee changed to the duty of the eligible member to notify the Membership Committee of their eligibility for Life Membership. Election of Officers: Candidates must be a member in good standing and have attended at least four meetings in the last 12

months. Current president and vice president my not run again in they've held the office for two consecutive years changed to two consecutive terms. Terms of office will be two years, with President and Vice President elected in even number years and Secretary and Treasurer elected in odd number years.

A motion was made to accept the changes to the constitution was made by Elaine, KC8FOs, seconded by Clark, N8PZD. Discussion ensued. Tom, W8KYZ, offered that this is the most significant change we've had in many, many years. Years ago we had 300 members, but membership has declined. We are trying to tighten things up and bring it to what we are trying to do. Carl shared that members who serve on the Board can get training to be an officer. The motion passed.

Tom, W1PDI talked about lists of podcasts in CQ Magazine about amateur radio. He will leave for people to pick up on the way out.

Chet, K8KIZ made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Tom, W1PDI. The motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 7:08.

ARRL Good Phone Operating

ON GOOD PHONE OPERATING

- Listen much...with care. Avoid distractions in your operating room. Tune the band well after each call.
- Time your calls; monitor your own frequency.
 Call only when a station is free.
- 3. Make short calls, with breaks to listen. Speak clearly, at a steady, modest rate. Three short calls are better than one long one.
- Use push-to-talk technique...speak near the mike. Watch the modulation indicator. Keep local background noise at a minimum.
- Make notes. Avoid missing points for comment. Jot down topics to avoid repeats.
- Talk in connected thoughts and phrases. Notes
 will help avoid mixing up subjects. Push-to-talk technique will keep brother amateurs from calling you a
 monologuist.
- Speak naturally. QSOs need not be cut and dried.
 Make them interesting. Avoid exhibitionism. Use proper operating form to promote efficiency in communication and add respect and prestige for your station.

Use of this standard list is recommended by ARRL. Haphazard selection of words often results in confusion. A degree of uniformity in use of phonetic words reflects favorably on your individual operating, and on the whole amateur service.
