NOARS April 20 and May 18 Meetings Will be Held on Zoom

Below is information sent by Carl. W8KRF in an email.

What do I need to participate in a zoom meeting?

You will need a computer or device with a webcam and microphone to participate in a Zoom session. If you do not wish to have an account, all you'll need to do to participate is click on the link for the class that your contact will send to you via an email invitation.

Do you have to have a zoom account to join a meeting?

A Zoom account isn't required to attend a meeting. Users do need a Zoom account to host a meeting. ... Anyone can join a meeting using the Zoom mobile apps or desktop applications for Windows and Mac.

Do you need a webcam for zoom?

Do I have to have a webcam to join Zoom? You are not required to have a webcam to join a Zoom group video call. You will not be able to transmit your video. You will continue to be able to listen to video calling and view any screen sharing.

How long is a free Zoom meeting?

With the free version of Zoom, users can hold an unlimited number of meetings, but group meetings with multiple participants are capped at 40 minutes in length, and meeting can't be recorded.

RFSOC, An Amazing New Chip

Chet, K8KIZ, received the following in an email.

Thought you might be interested in the part I am currently designing with. (Datasheet attached.)

It is a new family of FPGAs called an RFSOC. The SOC means "System-On-Chip"; The RF implies it has Radio Frequency capability. An SOC combines the logic resources/capabilities of the traditional FPGA with an ARM based processor subsystem. The RF portion consists of multiple, 12bit/14bit ADCs sampling at 4.096 Gbps and multiple 14bit DACs sampling at 6.554 Gbps.

The era of affordable direct RF conversion and software defined radio has most certainly arrived. Take this chip, add an antenna, LNA, and PA and you've got a full functioning radio transceiver with enough processing power to run a user interface, Ethernet access and pretty much any encoding/decoding scheme desired; Even MIMO, Beamforming and Radar.

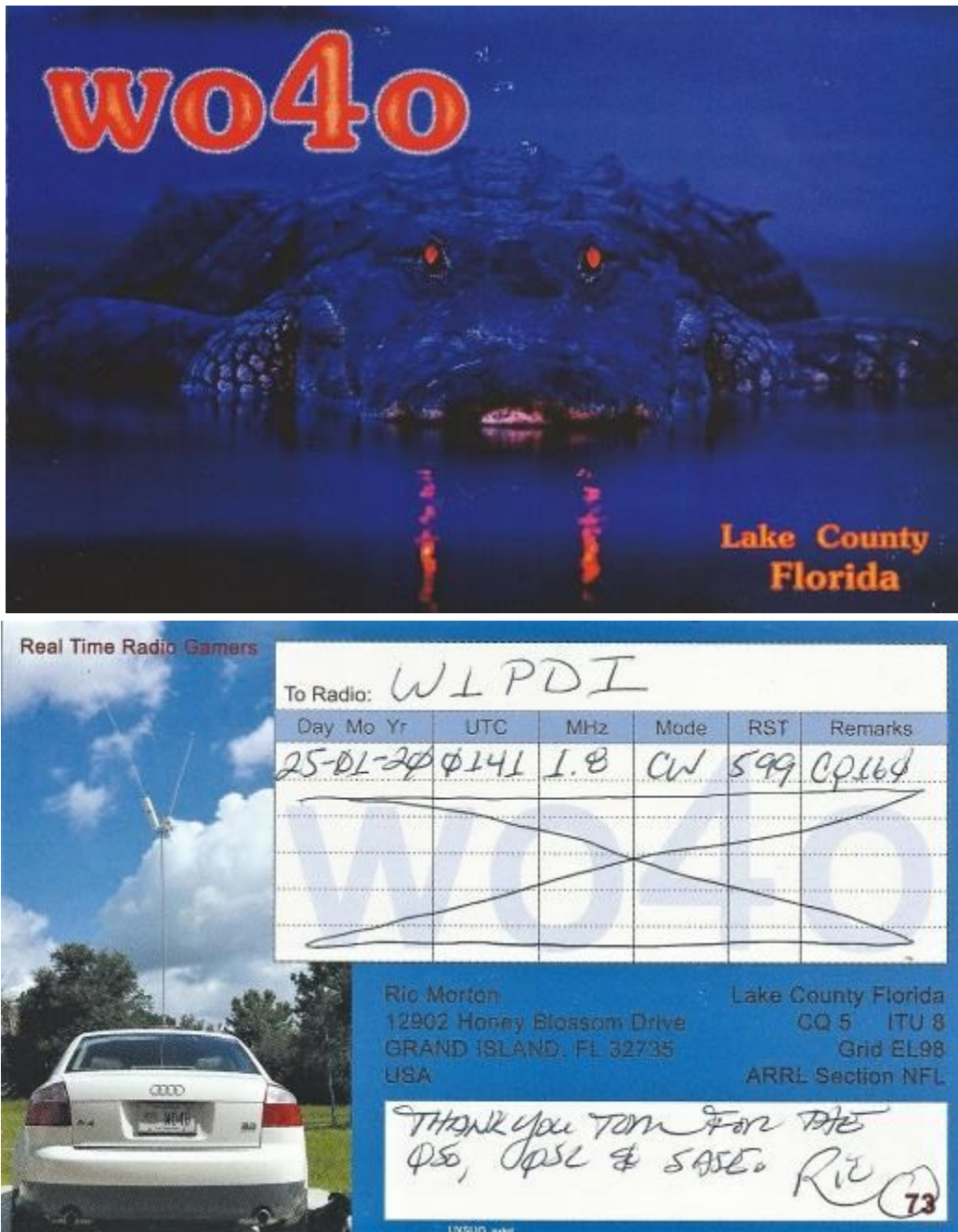

Golden Nuggets from the Sixties

Sent in by Tom, W1PDI

A.A.R.L Official Observer's Cooperative Reports from the Sixties. Received by an adolescent W1PDI, known then as WN1GLS.

Remember these, from back when Official Observers monitored the airwaves?

A.R.R.L. OFFICIAL OBSERVER'S COOPERATIVE REPORT

Dear WN1GLS

Your signals were RST. 5-7-9 the frequency noted 7410 kc.

on 9/24/66 at 1619 GMT, when you were ~~working~~ calling CQ & W1CYS

FCC monitoring stations are checking violations of all amateur regulations. This friendly notice is to invite attention to the above noted off-frequency operation resulting from harmonic (or parasitic) radiations so that you may get at the trouble and avoid official citations. Harmonics are at integral multiples of the operating frequency, while parasitics are at any frequency, almost always unstable, chirpy and rough with considerable drift.

Data on parasitic elimination and harmonic reduction may be found in the ARRL Handbook. See How to Keep Harmonics Off the Air, May '60 QST; Evils of Multiband Ant. Systems, and the Cure (bandpass filters Mar. '57 QST) and 80-Meter Loading Without Harmonics, Aug. '58 QST. Suggestions for reduction of harmonic radiation: 1. Use an antenna tuner. 2. Link couple antenna tuner to final. 3. Ground one side or center-tap of the link. 4. Ground the transmitter chassis. 5. Check transmitter for proper drive, bias, and neutralization.

To check results, ask at least three other amateurs to look for the offending signal, since skip, QRN, or QRM may be present. Better still, arrange with the Official Observer who sends you this card for a check at some scheduled time. Would welcome a line from you on how you fixed your trouble — to help others.

This friendly notice from one amateur to another is to invite your attention to the above. Government monitors check the bands looking for violations of all regulations. We hope our information may help you to avoid jeopardizing our amateur operating privileges. Where a report concerns operating procedure violations or signal conditions contrary to FCC or DOT rules, a re-reading of applicable sections of the regs may help. In any event we hope it's clear this is NOT a citation, but information sent in the best spirit of the amateur tradition.

The nature of signal difficulties and possible remedies will be indicated in the *Radio Amateur's Handbook*. See index there or consult QST. We urge personal steps to look into all discrepancies, if they are found to check with your log of transmissions. This is necessary since, if not corrected, signal or procedural conditions reflect on personal operation status and may bring official advisory warnings or citations as well. In addition to one's own signal monitoring, a friend across town who will give candid and honest reports can often help. ARRL has devised a Technical Aid Sheet (TAS-1) to supplement its Official Observer efforts. The more common difficulties noted in OO reports are discussed to give information on correcting such problems and some tips given on monitoring one's own signal. For this you are invited to send a self-addressed stamped envelope to the ARRL Communications Department, if interested. Ask for TAS-1. Luck and 73.

membership. If there is a vacancy on the Board after appointments are made, the President may appoint a full member to serve, for not more than two years. Appointment will be commensurate with the President's term of office. Officers – elected annually in accordance with Article 7 of the Bylaws. One-year term changed to two-year term.

Changes to the Bylaws: Automatic life membership – Duty of the Membership Committee changed to the duty of the eligible member to notify the Membership Committee of their eligibility for Life Membership.

Regular business meetings – Specific time used to be given, requiring a Bylaw change complete with vote. Not practical. Regular business meetings will be held the third Monday at each month at a time and place determined by the President, with consent of the Board.

Meetings may be changed for holidays or special events.

Election of Officers: Candidate must be a member in good standing and have attended at least four meetings in the last 12 months. Current president and vice president may not run again if they've held the office for two consecutive years changed to two consecutive terms. Terms of office will be two years, with President and Vice President elected in even number years and Secretary and Treasurer elected in odd number years.

Motion made to accept the changes to the constitutional amendments made by Dan, W8AJF, seconded by Bob, W8NNC. Motion passed. New Constitution will be on the NOARS Website

Chet, K8KIZ made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Tom, W1PDI. The motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 7:05.
