NOARS June 15 Meeting Will be Held on Zoom

Below is information sent by Carl. W8KRF in an email.

What do I need to participate in a zoom meeting?

You will need a computer or device with a webcam and microphone to participate in a Zoom session. If you do not wish to have an account, all you'll need to do to participate is click on the link for the class that your contact will send to you via an email invitation.

Do you have to have a zoom account to join a meeting?

A Zoom account isn't required to attend a meeting. Users do need a Zoom account to host a meeting. ... Anyone can join a meeting using the Zoom mobile apps or desktop applications for Windows and Mac.

Do you need a webcam for zoom?

Do I have to have a webcam to join Zoom? You are not required to have a webcam to join a Zoom group video call. You will not be able to transmit your video. You will continue to be able to listen to video calling and view any screen sharing.

How long is a free Zoom meeting?

With the free version of Zoom, users can hold an unlimited number of meetings, but group meetings with multiple participants are capped at 40 minutes in length, and meeting can't be recorded.

Golden Nuggets from the Sixties

W1PDI de WA1GGN K

Those of you who were present last spring during a NOARS meeting for my tower project presentation may recall I started it off with the reason how and why I became a ham. Breaking my left forearm during an exhibition baseball game in 1966 at age 12, facing a summer of not being able to do much of anything closely resembling "fun" and coupled with the fact my dad was a ham, all added up for me studying for a novice license to occupy what would have been a long and boring summer of 1966.

My dad built a code oscillator using the small chassis from some GE radio something or other and every night we would practice along with listening to W1AW code practice runs. I studied pretty quickly (what else did I have to do?), took my novice test (administered by my dad's radio station co-worker) and received my novice in late May/early June in 1966. I immediately jumped into ham radio almost nonstop. I had a CW QSOs with another new novice just two towns away, Dan, WN1GGN in October of that year. With my call sign

WN1GLS it was apparent we both received our "tickets" within a few weeks of each other.


Dan and I had many CW QSO's over our novice year and even after Dan passed his general test before I did, we still would cross paths over the air waves.


By the time I entered high school my ham radio days were put on hold. I was more into high school baseball, hockey, girls, close friends and cars-not necessarily in that order. I even had a 1965 Pontiac GTO while in high school so ham radio was pretty much relegated to the "unimportant" status for me.


I did jump back into ham radio after returning home for summer college break in 1972 and even built a Heathkit HW101 and power supply, both of which I still own. By then I had lost touch with WA1GGN but always remembered his call sign and often wondered if Dan was still an active ham or not.



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Fast forward to this past March. I was operating CW in a contest. After a contact on 40 meters I was being called by a familiar call sign which I hadn't heard in more than 50 years: W1PDI de WA1GGN.

Quite a surprise. Dan and I had a short CW QSO and

exchanged QSL cards and have spoken on the phone a few times since. This prompted me to begin reviewing my old logbooks and, using QRZ.com, determine if any of my 50+ year old contacts were still active. No luck so far but if I discover any I'll make it a point to reach out and attempt to schedule a 50th anniversary QSO. Wow, amazing how fast 50 years in ham radio has passed by!

ARRL Special Waiver for Field Day 2020

1) For Field Day 2020 only, Class D stations may work all other Field Day stations, including other Class D stations, for points.

Field Day rule 4.6 defines Class D stations as "Home stations," including stations operating from permanent or licensed station locations using commercial power. Class D stations ordinarily may only count contacts made with Class A, B, C, E, and F Field Day stations, but the temporary rule waiver for 2020 allows Class D stations to count contacts with other Class D stations for QSO credit.

2) In addition, for 2020 only, an aggregate club score will be published, which will be the sum of all individual

entries indicating a specific club (similar to the aggregate score totals used in ARRL affiliated club competitions).

Ordinarily, club names are only published in the results for Class A and Class F entries, but the temporary rule waiver for 2020 allows participants from any Class to optionally include a single club name with their submitted results following Field Day.

May 18, 2020 Zoom Meeting Minutes

This was the second Membership Meeting held over Zoom, a video conferencing platform, used during this era of Covid-19 with its continuing need for social distancing.

Twenty-five people were in attendance.

Comments before the meeting:

Dave, KY8OSU, reported an issue with the power supply for the Wires-X machine. After removing the power supply's fuse, then reinserting it, it worked. Brief discussion ensued.

Carl recognized Dave Molseed, KE8MVS, a relatively new member. Dave is with the Boy Scouts. His young sons are Zak, KE8MVR and Elijah, KE8NES.

The meeting brought to order by club president Carl, W8KRF, at 7:11 PM.

A motion to accept the April meeting minutes, as they were published in the newsletter, was made by Carl, W8KRF, seconded by Dan, K8KGX. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Tom, W8KYZ. The only expense was Windstream for \$70.49. Balance reported. There were no questions. Tom, W8KYZ, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, seconded by Dan, W8AJF. The motion passed.

Repeaters: Carl. The repeaters seem to be OK. Someone has been interfering with them during the nets. Carl can shut the repeaters down when that happens. Carl shut down the repeater for a half hour when someone dialed 411 four or five times.

Website: Carl. No problems.

Membership: We currently have 81 members.

Field Day: Al, N8CX. Al recognized Eric, N8AUC as representing LCARA. Tom, W8KYZ, reported on Lorain County Metroparks, with whom he historically makes a reservation for Indian Hollow, at which we hold Field Day each year. The park is closed at this time. The parks will call him. Al reported that after conferring with Eric, NOARS and LCARA will not have Field Day this year, that people will work from home. A poll needs to be taken. Questions: Who would come to set up, who would operate? What about food? Al turned the discussion over to Eric: Eric loves Field Day. Field Day is the most

fun when the most people show up. The camaraderie and fellowship make it all. However, club leadership needs to make decisions for the good of the group, and none of us are spring chickens anymore. Eric wouldn't be able to live with himself if someone came to Field Day because he promoted it and they got sick as a result. Chances that would happen are pretty small, but the chance isn't zero. Consensus is to not gather and operate from home. Carl took a poll online during the discussion. Discussion during polling - Dan, W8AJf suggested that he will go to his model airplane field and do Field Day from there. Ann, KA8ZEP, related that Indian Hollow was open when she and Dan, W8AJF were there, including bathrooms. Al interjected that the parks are open for individuals, not groups. Vote results: 73% no, 14% yes, 14% not sure. End result is no.

Dave, KY8OSU, opined that a vote should be taken of the people who participate and set up for Field Day. That's the vote that really counts. Eric said that's a good idea, but the fly in the ointment is the permit. Cleveland Metroparks have rescinded any permits for gatherings of over 10 people. If Lorain County goes that way, we won't get a permit. We couldn't stay overnight, couldn't do Field Day. Dave wondered if there were anyone with a few acres of land that would be willing to host Field Day on their property. Carl responded that it's not the place, it's the fact people may get sick. We need to respect ourselves and others. Dave responded that's the reason we should take a vote among the people that normally attend Field Day. Carl said he will send out a poll to the entire membership.

Al asked Tedd, of the Northern Ohio DX Association, what they will do this year. Tedd said it's a wait-and-see thing, but the majority of NODXA don't want to have it. He said it's not a case of not wanting Field Day. People don't want to group together. Carl agreed. There are too many unsure things. Eric reminded everyone that we're not canceling Field Day forever. We've started a good tradition of LCARA and NOARS doing Field Day together; consider this a one-year hiatus. A suggestion was made that maybe Field Day could be postponed a month. Discussion ensued. We need to make a decision tonight whether to have Field Day or not. A lot of work needs to be done before the event. Food and supplies to keep the group going needs to be planned and

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prepared, which takes time. Al suggested that tonight's poll is no, LCARA's poll is no, so most people would not go, anyway. Eric agreed, saying we should just pull the plug and have a hiatus for one year. Carl asked for Tom, W8KYZ's input. He said it's a case of the planning involved, and the Metroparks. They have given no indication of when a decision will be made of parties greater than ten. Even if we have it, due to age and health conditions, he would not be able to attend.

Carl said he could see that Dave, KY8OSU was not happy with the decision, but if he can find someone to have Field Day with, such as Dan, W8AJF, then it's up to him.

Carl made a motion that NOARS not get involved with Field Day this year. Tom, K1TRB seconded. Eric, N8AUC said according to Roberts Rules of Order Carl can't make a motion. Carl asked for input from Tom, N8FDY, NOARS' Parliamentarian, who couldn't be heard. Tom, W8KYZ made the motion that NOARS not have Field Day, seconded by Tom, K1TRB. The motion passed.

Ann, KA8ZEP, asked who made the motion, Carl or Tom, W8KYZ. Carl said Tom did since according to the Parliamentarian he can't make a motion. Lot's of discussion ensued. Tom, N8FDY advised that Roberts Rules of Order say any member can make a motion, the club president is a member of the club, therefore he or she can make a motion. Since the Parliamentarian could not be heard, Elaine, KC8FOS, related the information that anyone, including officers, can make motions. A count is not needed, according the Tom, N8FDY, unless a member wants one.

NOARSFest: Carl. Colleges and universities will be closed until September, at least. We don't know about LCCC's convention center. Tom, W8KYZ, has been in contact with Jose, our liaison with the college. Jose is unsure, but when he returns to work he will let us know. Carl feels that chances are we will not be able to hold it.

We need to make a decision so we have enough time to notify people if that's the case. Comments from Tom Porter, W8KYZ: We are pretty late in planning it. He has seen that about 80% of other clubs' hamfests have been canceled. Carl: The next membership meeting will be June 15, which would be too late to make that decision. The Board will meet to take a vote on it.

Sunshine: Tom, W8KYZ. Bob Tome, W8RET, is still a patient at Life Care in Elyria. Tom thinks Bob will be in long term care of some type. Tom talked to Bob last week, and it does not look favorable.

Programs: Anthony Luscre, K8ZT, offered via email, online programs and can present at the membership meeting on June 15. Three programs sound interesting: FT8 and FT4, QSLing in an online world, and involving youth in amateur radio. What sounds the most interesting? A poll was taken. FT4 and FT8, 5. QSLing, 0. Youth involvement, 6. Youth involvement in amateur radio will be the June 15th program. The program is based on the presenter's article in the March 2020 issue of CQ magazine. There was brief discussion of who would host – Carl or Anthony. Bill, K2WJS, advised that Anthony did the program for CARS last week, and there was no problem with his taking over the meeting, showing his slides, then handing it back. Anthony's all set up for that.

Newsletter: Tom, N8FDY. Please submit items by May 26th, including things for sale. If anything sells, let him know so it can be removed from the newsletter.

Comments: Dave reminded everyone of the 10 m net Tuesday, Food Group on Wednesday, and the 2 m net on Thursday. All are welcome.


