Whew! What a weekend. I hope you all had fun doing our Covid-19 version of Field Day. I did and from what I saw on our Totals page, Tom W1PDI did fantastic. He did mainly CW and tore it up with 325 contacts with a total QSO score of 611. Never knew he was a major contester. If nothing else, the Club Score Processor program brought the competitiveness out of me. I did mostly digital (PSK/FT8) with only a few PH contacts. FT8 turned out to be the best but PSK was okay. I tried to keep up with Tom's number of contacts but the average elapsed time for an FT8

exchange is at least 1 minute. I am betting Tom did 2-3 at least in that time. Of course, PSK is even slower. I did 216 contacts with a final total QSO score of 429. My generator ran great with only one stop to gas up. The other members who participated in the Club Score Processor were: Bob W8NNC, George WA8YVF, AI N8CX, Tom N8FDFY, Dave KY8OSU, Erik KD8RNF, and Elaine KC8FOS with combined contacts of 383 and a total points score of 584. So, the total QSO Points for the 9 of us was 1,624. Al N8CX operated 1B so he gets lots of bonus points bringing his total (Continued on page 2)


his new linear amplifier, including where to put the dummy load in the lineup. For the complete question and answer, go to page 52 in the July issue.

NOARSfest Cancelled



NOARS July 20 Meeting Will be Held on Zoom

Below is information sent by Carl. W8KRF in an email.

What do I need to participate in a zoom meeting?

You will need a computer or device with a webcam and microphone to participate in a Zoom session. If you do not wish to have an account, all you'll need to do to participate is click on the link for the class that your contact will send to you via an email invitation.

Do you have to have a zoom account to join a meeting?

A Zoom account isn't required to attend a meeting. Users do need a Zoom account to host a meeting. ... Anyone can join a meeting using the Zoom mobile apps or desktop applications for Windows and Mac.

Do you need a webcam for zoom?

Do I have to have a webcam to join Zoom? You are not required to have a webcam to join a Zoom group video call. You will not be able to transmit your video. You will continue to be able to listen to video calling and view any screen sharing.

How long is a free Zoom meeting?

With the free version of Zoom, users can hold an unlimited number of meetings, but group meetings with multiple participants are capped at 40 minutes in length, and meeting can't be recorded.

June 15, 2020 Zoom Meeting Minutes

This was the third Membership Meeting held over Zoom, a video conferencing platform, used during this era of Covid-19 with its continuing need for social distancing.

Twenty-five people were in attendance.

Since the program preceded the business meeting, the meeting was brought to order by club president Carl, W8KTF, at 8:16 PM.

A motion to accept the May meeting minutes, as they were published in the newsletter, was made by Carl, W8KRF, seconded by Al, N8CX. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Tom, W8KYZ. The only expense was Windstream for \$70.49. Balance reported. There were no questions. Tom, W8KYZ, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, seconded by Dave, KY8OSU. The motion passed.

Repeaters: Carl. The repeaters seem to be OK. QRM continues during the nets. Carl shuts down the repeater when needed. Contact Carl if the repeater is off for an extended time as it may be unintentionally left off.

Website: Carl. No problems.

Membership: We currently have 83 members. Two members joined this month: New - Pete, KE8NQK and returning – Erik, KD8RNF.

Social Committee: Elaine, KC8FOS. Nine people attended the June Gathering of Family and Friends at Golden Corral in Elyria.

Programs: Carl suggested that we have Tony back to do something for us in the future. Elaine will contact him about that.

Field Day: Will be discussed later in the meeting.

NOARSFest: Carl. NOARSfest has been canceled. Tom, W8KYZ notified the ARRL and Jose, our contact at LCCC.

Sunshine: Tom Porter gave a short update on Bob Tome, W8RET. Dave, KY8OSU, added that Bob may have visitors. Bob needs to be notified ahead of time and can meet visitors somewhere near the front door.

Nets: Elaine. It has recently been a little frustrating to hold the nets since "our little friend" has been interfering. All in all, however, the nets have been doing well. Participants have been patient.

VE Testing: In-person testing will resume after July.

Newsletter: Tom, N8FDY. Please submit items by June 25th, including things for sale.

Old Business:

Field Day. Carl says we need to decide our club name for reporting the Field Day score. Decision was made that club name needs to be NOARS when individuals submit their Field Day scores to the ARRL. Carl will send an email with info about it. File your log yourself, do not submit to Al, N8CX, submit to ARRL. Al said it's easy to submit logs. It's a matter of answering questions and filling in the blanks. Carl says since we won't be operating as a group, we need to use our own call signs when transmitting during Field Day. This is why it's important that everyone uses the same club call sign when submitting our logs. Carl demonstrated Field Day logging software from N3FJP, including a club score processor.

Carl will lead a Pre-Field Day meeting on Zoom on Saturday, June 20th at 10 AM.

Repeater Interference. On a net night, after checking in, if there is interference, listen on the input and make a note of how strong the signal is. We may be able to get an idea of where he may be from the signal strengths. A foxhunt was discussed, partly to begin to find whomever is causing QRM on the repeater. We will have a foxhunt on Thursday, June 18, the place to be determined by the Social Committee.

Comments. Bill, K2WJS, concerning the person jamming the nets: Don't talk about it before or after the net. It just makes a thing of it. It's best to not say anything.

Jack, N8NDL: Dr. Jack has provided free antennas as door prizes at NOARSfests. Since fests have been canceled, he asked Carl if there were anything else to be done. Carl suggested having a drawing at the Holiday Banquet to win a free antenna. Dr. Jack said his 2M tribander is very popular, so is a good choice. The drawing will be done using a database of attendance at meetings. The more often one attends meetings, the great chance they have of winning.

Comments: Dave, KY8OSU reminded us of the 10 m net Tuesday, Food Group on Wednesday, and the 2 m net
