the RC-210 was ordered. I have been spending much time preparing for its arrival by reading all the manuals. Ken, the owner of ARCOM, included a free copy of his \$30 RCF Programmer, which I downloaded and activated. I have been learning how to program the RC-210, which is similar to programming the CAT controller. I am attempting to mimic the CAT functions as much as possible. I am at a point in that endeavor where it might be best to wait until the hardware arrives, load the programming data I have so far, and see what happens. I have all the wiring of the peripheral DB9 connectors completed. I have tested EchoLink, and it seems to be operational, but I won't know for sure until it is interfaced with the controller and the ports linked. I will try my best to get everything on the air as quickly as possible, but I want to especially make sure audio levels and quality are better than with the CAT.

I look forward to seeing you all in person again at the annual picnic on August 16.


















### **July NOARS Lunch**
