
Don't Forget the Fox Hunt

July 18, 2022

The meeting was held in person at the North Olmsted Public Library and via Zoom.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by club President Carl, W8KRF. There were 17 people in attendance and 9 via Zoom for a total of 26.

Pledge of allegiance

Introductions and roll call of all in attendance.

Motion to accept minutes as published in NOARS log. Jim, KD8OCW made the motion, seconded by Pete, KE8NQK. Motion passed

Committee Reports:

Treasurer's report – Tom W8KYZ

Monthly Expenses

Windstream \$73.45 for repeater/computer telephone line

Meeting Refreshments \$14.58.

Reimbursement of \$100 to LACARA for generator use at Field Day

Withdrawal of \$550 for startup money for NOARSFEST membership, admissions, 50/50 and parking lot

We will be getting the withdrawal money back.

No questions. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report made by Ann KA8ZEP, seconded by Tom W1PD.

Motion passed.

Club Property - Carl, W8KRF

We have property available for any member who wishes to borrow it. We have a new AA-650 analyzer, Loop antenna and MFJ antenna analyzer.

Repeaters - Carl W8KRF

The repeaters are going ok. The computer went out again. If it continues to happen, we will purchase a new one under the repeater budget. It is an old computer that has been around for a while. CMOS battery might be going; when the computer shuts down it will not start back up.

Question about kerchunking on repeater. The kerchunking could be intermodulation. They have installed new cell phone antennas on every corner of the building. But it was happening before that. It is RF intermod from something that sounds like someone talking. It desensitizes the receiver, drops out and comes back in. If it is noticed, the repeater will be shut off for a while until it stops. We will have to do something to find it if it gets really serious.

There was a question from Bill about the computer battery. It is a CMOS inside the computer which is old and not worth taking apart.

Website - Carl W8KRF

It's going OK. Carl has been in contact with HostGator about an issue of not being able to receive emails. We probably lost table sales at NOARSFEST because of unanswered emails. A few people called on the phone about it. That is when it was determined something was wrong. HostGator promised it will be put on high priority

Membership - Carl W8KRF

Good news - we gained 7 new members at NOARSFEST, including one from Florida. Membership now stands at 104 members. With more people interested, membership will grow. Lots of younger people showed up at NOARSFEST. Some of the younger hams are excited about Fox Hunts and were invited out.

Field Day - Carl W8KRF

Scores were submitted on Wednesday, 7/13. We did well. Three people joined in from home. We are around 1,100. We missed some bonus points we could have received, but with Al N8CX in the hospital and Carl stepping up but

NOARSFEST – Carl W8KRF

It was a record Hamfest, even though we had 10 tables left over. There were more in the flea market space outside. Fifteen different people were outside despite the rain. There were 171 attendees, the most we have had since Carl has been involved. Usually there are about 140 – 150 that attend. If it had not been for the email problem, we would have had more tables. There were a couple of walk-ins. We will be mailing 3 prizes to people that were not there. There will be a debrief on NOARSFEST as there was a problem with how prizes were distributed. We usually do not mail secondary prizes. No one really noticed and is just an issue of mailing them now.

We are getting ready for Winter Hamfest already.

Tom, W8KYZ At this point we will have about \$1,100 profit from the event. No bill yet from Lorain County Community college. That will include the concession stand, VE testing room for 4 hours at \$20 an hour.

We want to thank Dr. Jack for his donation to the club for prizes as well as Heartland TV (Joe and Patty).

Dave W1AFC of Oberlin donated equipment to be sold with the money \$277 going to the club. This does not get included in NOARSFEST profit. David is very ill and that

Question about donation table: Did anyone give money for that. Yes, the club received \$65.50 from the table.

50/50 - Thanks to Jeany, KC3QND and Ann, KA8ZEP \$112 was raised for the club and Bryan N8OOF was the winner of \$112.

No motion is needed as the profit will be finalized next month when we receive the final bill.

Here is a cool antenna suggestion:

"In fact, to get started you'll only need an antenna—something like my speaker wire antenna, for example, that consists of two wires: one 28.5 foot radiator and one

28.5 foot counterpoise. This random wire antenna is simply one length of 28.5' speaker wire I pulled apart into two 28.5 foot lengths. I attach it to the radio with a common BNC binding post adapter. Setup is simple: one wire goes into a tree, one lays on the ground. The X6100's internal ATU will easily find an impedance match so you don't even need an in-line transformer."
