I just finished participating in the North American QSO party (NAQP). Although I am not in it to win it, I find these types of contests/events good for multiple things. Not only does it help with logging skills, for me that means conversion from ADIF to Cabrillo, and actually learning the inner workings of the format required but it can also help with learning your equipment and a reminder of the etiquette and rules we all know. With the bands packed QRM and splatter are rampant and available spacing nonexistent. It becomes important to use features in your rig you may not need at other times. Filters, noise blanker and RF vs

AF gain become useful to pull out that weak or sometimes not so weak station that you need. Using those filters and spacing options can help eliminate some of the QRM and help you make that QSO. One of the things I learned early on was having the digital noise reduction ready to quickly turn on/off can be an ear saver especially when someone else is tuning up over your possible QSO and they are 5,9+10. Another thing I noticed, and the first thing I fixed, was my quick memory banks. The programmed bands were not in any particular order. Not a big issue on a normal day but as I wanted to go seamlessly from 80 to 40 to 20 etc.






The Wadsworth POTA Machine Continues
