We had one newly licensed ham Craig, KE8WXH, who made two QSOs, Joshua, unlicensed, who made one QSO and Richard, unlicensed, who made five QSOs. Out of the twenty-five QSOs, seventeen were made by YL's: Amelia, ten years old, who made one QSO and Emma, eight years old, who made one QSO.

Now the special shout out to Geri, ten-year-old daughter

of Gerald, WY8F, who made fifteen QSOs, including the first one for GOTA which was in Quebec. After getting comfortable with a few, Geri was a pro sending out the Kilo Eight Golf callsign to CQs being heard and confidently responding QSL Five Alpha Ohio when called, along the way learning some of the nuances of HF contacts. Knowing that if you are not getting heard sometimes, wait a few seconds before answering, and the disappointment when hearing Kilo Eight Whiskey something instead of Golf, only to have to try, try again.

Member Highlight Eric Hatfield, KE8VZA

Buildup to Ham Radio

Eric got hooked on the magic of radio with CB radio many years ago. A friend's father who was a ham told him how many more possibilities ham radio offered, and apparently that stuck with him. Eric passed the Technician class exam in eight months ago, in November of 2022 and the General class exam in January of 2023. He joined NOARS as a Technician.

Enjoyment of the Hobby

Eric is fascinated by how radio works and enjoys learning more. There are so many facets of ham radio to explore. Antenna design is particularly fascinating to him. He also enjoys the various nets, checking into several 2m nets weekly with NOARS and other clubs, including the Food Net, Tech Net, and occasionally the Woodchucks Net. He also checks in daily on the Barometer Net and every Sunday and Wednesday on the Beacon Net.

Modes of Operation

Eric does not yet own an HF radio. He currently uses FM in the 2m and 70cm bands. He's interested in getting on SSB and FT8 modes when he eventually buys an HF radio. He owns a Yaesu FTM-6000R and a Yaesu FTM-300DR, both of which he really likes. The 6000 was his first dual band mobile rig and says it is very easy to program and use. He moved it between his car and house until he bought the 300 which is currently his base radio.

Eric says he has only scratched the surface with regard to the 300's capabilities. HF rigs he's considering include the Yaesu 710, 991A, 891, and the Icom 7300.



Participation in NOARS

Eric has participated in several club activities so far, such as the Fox Hunts and POTA. He also worked the front table at the NOARS Winter Hamfest. He looks forward to future activities. He serves as a new member of the NOARS Social Committee.

Learning

Eric is learning about C4FM and wants to learn more about digital modes and antennas. He plans to build a better directional antenna for fox hunts.

Exciting Experience

Eric says it was very exciting to witness Will, KE8WHM make his first DX contact, "over the pond" with a gentleman in Norway at the NOARS POTA outing in May, using his wire antenna.

He is a Navy veteran from the 1980s and early 90s. He's married with two kids, currently in college. He is an Industrial Engineer working for US Cotton in Cleveland, a company that makes consumer cotton products such as swabs, balls, and pads.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Introductions and roll call of all in attendance (in person/zoom).

Motion to accept May meeting minutes as published in the NOARS Log was made by Dan, W8AJF; Seconded by Andrew, KE8WMS. Minutes accepted.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Treasurer Report – Tom W8KYZ - Expenses: Windstream - \$79.52; May meeting refreshments - \$14.77; 500 Winter Ham Fest Tickets - \$53.25; Byonics Microfox - \$115.

Motion to accept the Treasurer Report was made by Carl, W8KRF; Seconded by Jim, KD8OCW. Treasurer report accepted.

Membership – Carl, W8KRF - We have 124 members.
