Indeed. Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish Franciscan, received permission to operate a shortwave radio station that was licensed on Sept. 9, 1938, as SP3RN. Father Kolbe went on to receive a permit to construct a radio station which he used for outreach. He was arrested by the Nazis in

1939 and killed in Auschwitz on August 14, 1941. The Catholic Church venerates him as the patron saint of amateur radio operators, drug addicts, political prisoners, families, journalists, and prisoners.


