# There's a Storyteller in our Midst – Linn Keller, KD8NGE

Some of you know Linn from the nets as well as the Tuesday lunches. Some of you may remember Paul Harvey, radio broadcaster, for his Rest of the Story series.

Paul Harvey, rest his honorable soul, used to make occasional mention of Tall Paul the Cowboy.

I got curious and ambitious at the same time and wrote him a letter.

I'd like to hear more about Tall Paul, said I, but it wouldn't be fair to ask for a story without offering one, so here's mine.

Back when dirt was young and so was I, back when I was young and skinny, my Granddad bought a horse. He'd always wanted to be a cowboy, but he'd long labored in the family's Appalachian oilfield in the Perry County hill country, a convoluted landscape where most of the terrain stands on its side, where the only level ground is on the snaking backbone of a ridge (wide as your kitchen table) or in the bottoms (measured in acres and damned few of those!) Granddad decided one fine day -- after he was honestly of retirement age -- that he was going to buy himself a saddle horse. He did. He made some of the poorest choices he could, without knowing it.

The good choice was an Appaloosa horse. Unfortunately, the other qualifications were not ... ideal. He bought a three-year-old. Green broke. Stallion. Apple-horse might have had a career in politics, as he bribed well, and showed a definite affinity for Union Workman brand, molasses cured, chawin' tobacker.

Unfortunately, being green broke, his training was less than minimal, and Granddad found to his distress that Terra Firma was quite a bit more firma than his old bones could possibly enjoy. Granddad, rest his soul, had a good percentage of hardheaded German in his ancestry: not

willing to admit he made a mistake, he said "That horse just needs ridden more to gentle him down. I've two fine grandsons who can help." Of course, my eleven-year-old brother and my thirteen-year-old self jumped on the enthusiastic bandwagon -- or, rather, the stallion.

We'd walk the mile from home to Granddad's pasture (distance, terrain and weather hold few terrors for the young) and Apple would come to the bobwarr fence, hoping for a bribe. We'd bribe him with a thick pinch of tobacker and then we'd run up and down our side of the bobwarr, and Apple would run with us, turning and racing us. We were three kids, playing in the mint-fragrant bottomland. One or the other of us would swarm over the bobwarr, grab a double handful of mane, swing bareback a-straddle of a three-year-old stallion, lock our boot heels around his barrel as far as we could reach and that stallion would whip around and run.

Apple-horse, juvenile that he was, had two speeds: wide open, and dead stop: he'd shove his nose straight out, lay his ears back, and punch a hole in the air as he ran, and our guardian angel hung onto the back of our belt with one hand while streaming like a gauzy kite tail along behind, trying desperately to keep up. The passing wind stripped tears out the corners of our eyes and ran them into our ears, and you'd had to have used a hammer and chisel to get the grin off our face. When we rode Apple-horse, we were not horse and rider. No. We were bare chested GODS, and we rode the wind itself!

That's the letter I wrote Paul Harvey. Sometime later, a co-worker told my wife she'd heard Paul Harvey mention my name -- Linn Keller, of Lagrange, Ohio. We got the tape from the local radio station. Paul Harvey read my letter as his noontime closer on January 6, 2001.

And as old Paul said, "That ... is the RRRREST of the STORY!"




# The Fox Hunt was a Rollicking-Good Time
